

Energy Policy Statement

Albert Bartlett growers, processors, and packers of fresh potatoes and added value products are committed to achieving continual improvement in our energy performance and ensuring that our own operations and value chain are environmentally, socially, and economically sustainable.

To support this, we will develop and maintain an Energy Management System with the aim of meeting the requirements of the ISO 50001 standard at our Airdrie, Boston, Jersey, and Westwick sites and achieving certification by the end of 2025. To this end, we undertake to:

- Improve our policies and procedures to systematically track, analyse, and continuously improve energy efficiency (kWh/tonne) at our facilities and during our activities.
- Ensure that relevant stakeholders in our operations and value chain have the information and resources needed to enable us to meet our energy objectives and targets.
- Purchase sustainable and energy efficient products and services and support suppliers who provide high-quality goods that meet environmental and ethical standards as stated in our **Sustainable Procurement Strategy**.
- Consider energy performance improvement opportunities in the design of new, modified, and renovated facilities, equipment, systems, and energy-using processes, where applicable.
- Provide a clear framework to trace and validate reductions in energy costs due to the energy management system and subsequently inform updates to our annual energy budget.

The above activities will complement and support the delivery of commitments and targets in our **Environmental Policy**, including:

ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT SYSTEMS


- Complying with applicable regulations and standards relating to energy and greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions as detailed in our environmental **Legal Register**.
- Ensuring our colleagues have the appropriate training and environmental awareness needed to deliver their role in a way that supports the achievement of our environmental objectives.
- Maintaining our alignment with the ISO 14001 standard in our Airdrie and Boston sites via our internal audit programme and enabling our Westwick operations to meet the requirements of the ISO 14001 standard by the end of 2025.
